Q: What students participated?

A: All units in the College of Architecture, Art and Design participated in this cross-disciplinary design competition, including Building Construction Science, Interior Design, Architecture, & Graphic Design.

Q: Where did the competition take place?

A: The students presented their final work at the Cullis Wade Depot Art Gallery on Fri., Aug. 28 from 1:30 – 4 p.m. Reviewers from Brasfield & Gorrie General Contractors, Fuscia Architects and Brewworks, and Sweet Gum Brewing Company attended to review the student work and to choose teams for the top three design awards.

Q: Who was the client?

A: SweetGum Brewing Company, a new local brewery

Q: How much time was spent on the project?

A: "Within the two weeks, I spent approximately 55-60 hours working on this project with other members potentially spending an upwards of 70-75 hours during the design phase.
